

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**1848**-First Institution Opened Samuel Gridley Howe

**1857**-Ohio Asylum for the Education of Idiotic and Imbecile Youth-Columbus, Ohio "Training schools were considered an educational success, offering hope to many families with disabled children."

1861-1865-National Trauma, Civil War

**1865-1870**-Jobs needed for returning soldiers Increased Segregation

1894-Columbus, Ohio passed Ugly Law

"To Prohibit Street Begging, and to Restrain Certain Persons from Appearing in Streets and Public Places" (Schweik 2009: 291). As the name of this ordinance suggests, ugly laws were concerned with more than appearance, prohibiting both the activity of street begging and the appearance in public of "certain persons". The phrasing that one finds in the Chicago City Code in 1881 originates in this San Francisco law; the reference with that law to deformity, unsightliness, and being a "disgusting object" is common across comparable ordinances..." 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1915-1963-5 attempts to pass eugenics (sterilization) laws Sir Francis Galton

1916-Published "The Family of Sam Sixty: The Feeble Minded in Rural Ohio"

1925-Eugenics Law passed House and Senate. Vetoed by Governor Alan Victor Donahey.

1933-Cuyahoga County Council for Retarded Children

**1940**-Realization of Nazi Eugenics
Lives not worthy of living
275,000 people with disabilities murdered.

1960's-Parent Movement (Horn Report)

1967-County Board System Established

1969-Cabinet Level Department Established (ARC of Ohio Lobbied)

1970-Developmental Disabilities Service and Construction Act (New Facilities)

1972-Willowbrook Spurred Community Placements and Services

- Frame the Choice

- Name the Hurdle
  - We will be having meaningful and sometimes difficult conversations. We must be able to put our own interests aside for the sake of the cause.
- Reinforce Request
  - This is an option. If you decline, you will be missed but not forgotten.
- Make it Personal
  - Call, reach out individually. Make it specific to the person you want to attend.
