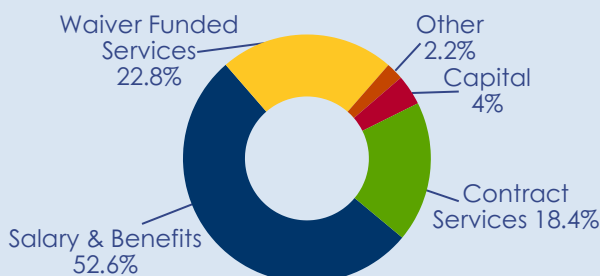


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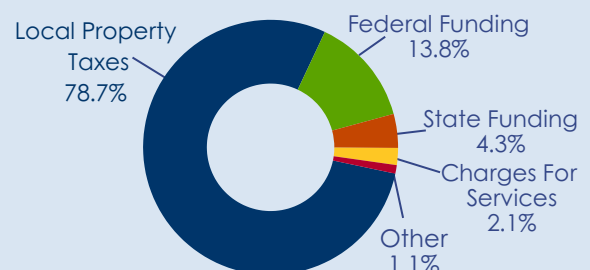

INITIATIVE HIGHLIGHTS

1 Independence



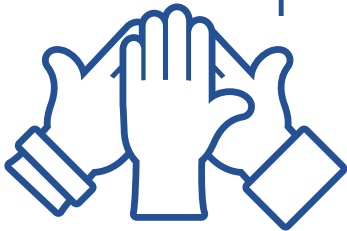
Growth, development, and independence are central to newly implemented services at Forest Rose, with school-age students participating in sensory-immersive therapy visiting a local equine farm and weekly yoga sessions that help preschoolers build self-regulation skills. There is also an increased focus on real-world skill development, including expanded use of Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) devices to support independence, learning, and safe access to information.

2 Collaboration



Fairfield DD continues to strengthen community partnerships to address service gaps and expand access to supports. Collaboration with Fairfield County 2-1-1 is streamlining resource tools for families, while DODD grant funding expands respite options. Working with the Fairfield County ESC also created a new classroom at River Valley Mall, increasing capacity for students with additional needs and reflecting strong community support shown in the successful May levy renewal.

3 Belonging



Fairfield DD continues to advance community inclusion by connecting people to meaningful activities, employment, and community life. Workgroups are strengthening interest-based planning and collaboration to support individualized goals. Donated funds are directed toward assistive technology, a scholarship program launches in 2026, and an online hub is being developed to centralize tools, best practices, and resources for families, providers, and the community.

4 Engaged Workforce



Fairfield DD is building a high-performing, engaged workforce through recruitment, retention, learning, and growth. Internal processes are being streamlined to focus on people, and the merit-based pay system now includes clear criteria and quarterly check-ins to recognize performance. Onboarding is being strengthened across departments for consistency, while staff are engaged in financial planning and resource management to support long-term sustainability and the agency's mission.
